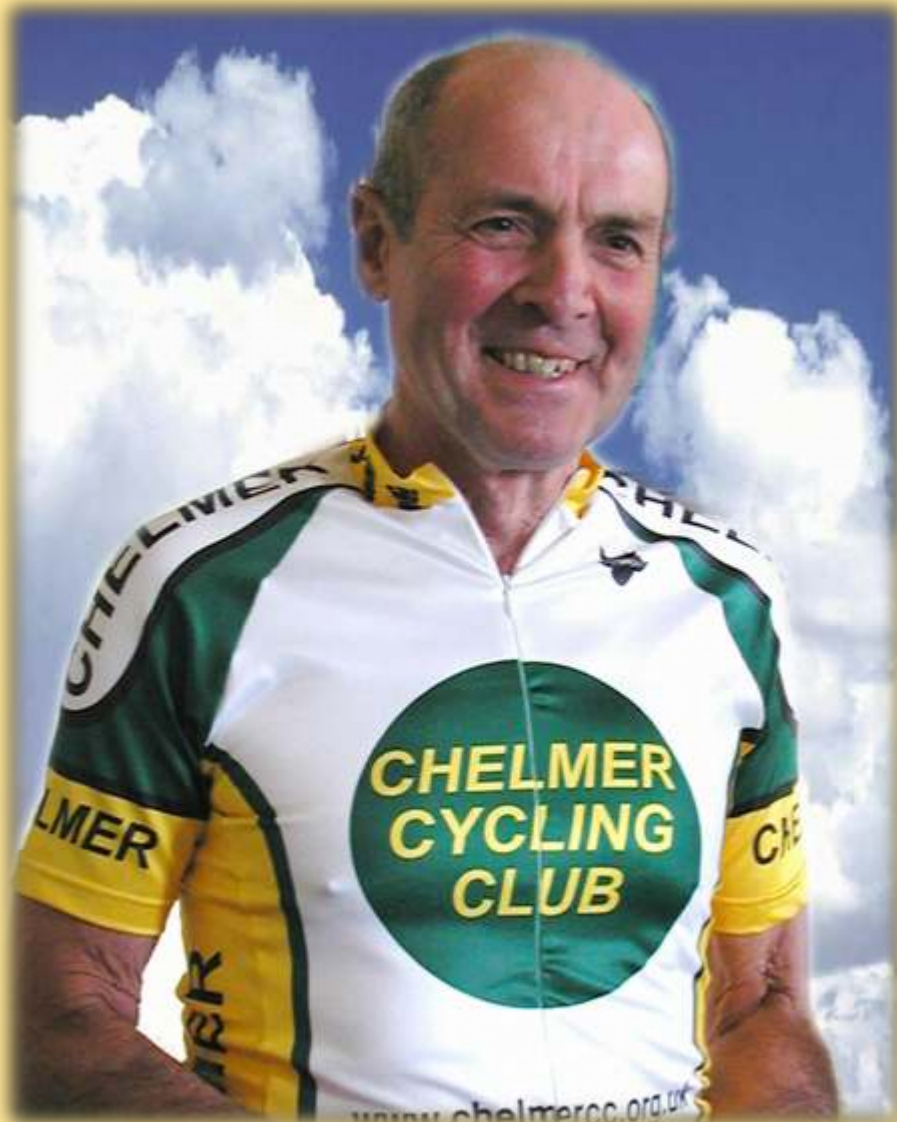

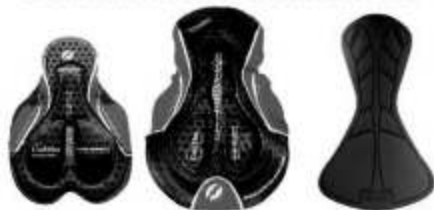

A legendary member of the timetrialling cycling fraternity was Joe. He will be greatly missed and it is so sad to think that we will never hear his mellifluous voice again. As I write this I note that readers will not receive this issue in time to attend the funeral should they wish—it being scheduled to be held on 6 January 2016 at Bramcote Crematorium at 2.45pm. Afterwards at The Risley Park Hotel, Risley. Family flowers only, donations, provisionally, to the British Heart Foundation. Those few who receive the email version of the magazine might like to know the details.

Most Groups will know that John Cook (*Brunwin's*) has retired and the business taken over by 1stStopDirect. The proprietor, Frank Power has had to work hard to get it started but, with the purchase of new equipment, believes the transfer will be satisfactory to all.

The Agenda for the AGM is enclosed. Few Groups hold meetings to instruct delegates but that doesn't mean members need not have their say. A few words to the Group Secretary might be some way in getting the views of the membership.

Webmaster Jim Gibb has been struggling to keep up with the changes necessary in order to introduce joining and renewal 'On-Line' in accordance with the instructions of the AGM a couple of years ago. The Committee has authorised the use of the British Cycling facility and work is 'in progress'.

On the subject of the website: at its last meeting, the Committee decided that, once approved, the minutes of each meeting should be posted thereon—something to look forward to!

Next year's Championships have been confirmed, with the four shortest distances being promoted again by the National Committee. The National Secretary is listed as the organiser for them but in effect the work will be shared amongst members of the Committee. The four Groups involved, Kent, Midlands, Nottingham and London, have all indicated their enthusiasm and it should be interesting to see how lessons learned from 2015 are put into practice.

It is at the December meeting that the National Committee considers the nominations for the prestigious awards—the Ted Bricknell for outstanding service to the Association and the C W Cooke for memorable achievement. John Golder of East Anglian was a clear winner of the Bricknell and Derek Stewart got the most votes from the long list of highly qualified contenders for the C W Cooke.

NATIONAL RECORDER

Peter Horsnell, Chelmer CC, can claim a clean sweep of the Best All Rounder and Three-Distance BAR competitions. He wins the BAR ahead of Adam Topham, High Wycombe CC, by a slim 14-second margin. In the Three-Distance competition Peter again beat Adam this time by a more comfortable margin of over five minutes. To this Peter can add no fewer than four team awards with Chelmer CC and East Anglian Group topping the tables of, respectively, the club and group team awards in both those competitions. Well done to him on a superb performance. Dave Green, Team Velovelocity, was third in both competitions.



In the short distance competition Ron Hallam, South Pennine RC, took a convincing win, beating last year's winner, Terry Icke, VC St Raphael, followed by Peter Yates, Otley CC. This competition is proving increasingly popular with 230 qualifiers this year, compared with 161 last year. North Lancs and Lakes take the group team prize and Team Swift are the winning club team.

The decision by CTT to declare the result of the Stockton 100 null and void meant that the VTTA also had to exclude this event from the result. Five of the affected riders had ridden another 100 in the year and we have been able to include them in the result, though with lesser times. Unfortunately, this left ten riders, all members of northern groups, with no qualifying 100 mile times. This has caused great disappointment and I offer my commiserations to those riders.

MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY

The past three months have been quite quiet with only 35 new members' applications being received. Sadly, of the 13 who have been deleted from the membership list, 9 have died.

North Lancs. and Lakes Group have been particularly active this month with 14 new members being enrolled. Details of the three months are as follows.

Total Membership as at the 30th November is now 2566 with 247 Partners, a total of 2813.

HLMs:

During the year to-date, 35 Members have received Honorary Life Membership status, making a grand total of 389 HLMs. We also have 5 Distinguished Life Members and 77 Life Members, one new LM being added this year.

In 2016, 41 Members will become eligible for Honorary Life Membership status, although of these 25 do not have a joining date on my Database. These members therefore will not receive automatic HLM status until their joining date has been ascertained.

It was nine years ago when the numbering of membership was introduced and it went from 0001 to 2778. At November this year the latest number issued was 5653 which seems to indicate a turnover approaching 3,000!

The group held its AGM on 1st November at Great Missenden.

No less than 12 were in attendance which meant that one tin of biscuits was sufficient and little effort was necessary in putting the chairs back in place. Oh yes, there was a meeting also (nearly forgot that bit!)

Jim Burgin reported on various matters from the past season, including the Committee's decision to award Marshals £30 expenses if assisting an event with more than 100 entries.

61 new members had enrolled in 2015 with 22 not renewing. Total membership at 1st November 2015 was 292, the second largest Group in the Association.

Promotions of two 10s on the F11/10 had been as

hectic as is now customary with an excess entry for each. In the event on 15 July there had been an accident involving two riders which had meant the cancellation after 30 or so had finished.

The same number of events were to be promoted in 2016, with new event secretaries for the 10s on F11/10; both of which had an earlier entry date.

The Committee had decided that those marshalling in events with less than 100 entries should receive a free ticket to the Annual Luncheon and Prize Presentation.

Chas Jepson distributed copies of the audited accounts which showed a healthy surplus on the year's turnover.

Geoff Perry produced a comprehensive spreadsheet containing full details of records set and qualifiers for the National Championships .

Jim confirmed that the Luncheon would be held at Aldenham Golf Club on Sunday the 24th of January 2016.

The tension mounted as the battle for places on the Committee drew near. It was a close run thing but, to the astonishment of those present, there were no changes to the composition of the administration for 2016, except that is for the inclusion of John Hoskins as a Committee Member.

After catching its breath, the meeting moved on to deciding that Geoff Perry and Chas Jepson should act as delegates to the VTTA AGM in January with Chas and Jim delegates for the London West DC.

The Group Committee were authorised to decide on the yeas and noes at the VTTA AGM.

By now in a relaxed frame of mind, the gathering decided on the implementation of a points competition in 2016. Details to follow.

What a memorable occasion!

I am in the process of checking results for standards and competitions and I will be listing all winners of various cups in the Merseyside Vets Newsletter. But I just want to take this opportunity to say well done to three of our stalwarts for claiming standards, something they haven't done for a while. I am nowhere near brave enough to mention their ages but congratulations to Pat Haywood for claiming four standards, all with plusses, John Maddox with two and Barry Ralphs with one.

Late August, I was heading out down the A41 on my way to a time trial across at Hull. Competitors in the 12 hour were just starting off. I thought, not too bad, a dry start, but good luck to everyone. I have nothing but praise for those competing, and the fact that they keep coming back every year. I only ever did the one, that was enough. Late afternoon, heading home from my time trial, I am again on the A41 not far from home to again see the 12 hour. I recognise Ian Casson, he's reaching into his back pocket, probably for sustenance. I murmur to myself, 'keep going Ian'. The group's Phil Warburton was the leading light with a distance of 262.12 miles, closely followed by team-mate Arthur Winstanley, with 252.56. Arthur had the satisfaction of winning his age group. Another regular to this race, Helen Tudor, flew the flag for the women with a distance of 209.60 miles and finally Derek Parry recording 185.23 miles.

supported event with seventeen members competing. Kevin Larmer was again fastest with a time of 21:49 (+4:29) for which he wins the Derek Ireland Rosebowl. Wrexham's RC Paul Holt was best on standard with a plus of 4:41 (22:18) to claim the Oscar Dover Memorial Shield. Helen Tudor of Oswestry Paragon won the Hilda Dover Cup as fastest woman with a time of 26:20 (+2:14). Others competing were, Peter Groom 22:37 (+4:04), John Flynn 23:02 (+4:36), Ian Hawkins 23:15 (+3:17), Phil Guy 23:57 (+4:35), George Aldridge 24:10 (+3:58), Derek Parry 24:16 (+3:58), Clive Gudgeon 24:25 (+3:07), Ian Casson 24:31 (+3:28), D J Fanning 25:09 (+1:36), Dave Smith 26:06 (+3:08), Geoff Edgerton 27:03 (+1:39), Harry Cowley 28:38 (-0:06), Peter Booth 29:00 (+0:26) Ian Corrin 39:49 (-12:05). The last group event of the season was North Shropshire Wheelers 25 with fourteen Mersey Vets making it to the start line. After the elation reported in the previous copy of The Veteran with regard to Group Member Richard Bideau's British record breaking 100 performance and additionally the new Team Record set by the North Lancashire Road Club all was brought down to earth with a bang just a few days before going to press with this current issue.

It is a long story but any readers of the Timetriallingforum will likely have followed the saga. Around three months after the event - which was held on 5th July - there was a suspicion flagged that the course was possibly short. A further month on and after a re-measuring of the course - which showed it to be around 750 yards short - Cycling Time Trials published a statement that the rides in that event were now Null and Void.

We can only sympathise with Richard along with the team of Steve Irwin, Ian Cox and Brian Fogarty and as far as our VTTA Group are concerned to Peter Greenwood and Dave Hargreaves who also set Personal Bests and record breaking rides.

At our Group AGM in October our Chairman John Leach finally found his successor after several years of trying, with workhorse Richard Taylor of the West Pennine Road Club taking the role on board. We thank John for his 14 years in office and we are sure to see him around our sport in this area in the future. Richard takes the position on top of his Recorder's position and as well as the promotion of two of the three time trials of our Group. Richard is also the Chairman of the North Lancashire Time Trials Association who saw its near 90 years of existence coming to an end a couple of years ago and thankfully saved by Richard and a new band of NLTTA officials.

At the AGM, Secretary Derek Black gave his report which included the 2016 programme of the CTT North District Council to which we are linked. He said that there will be 11 x 25s, 20 x 10s, 2 x 30s, 1 x 50 and 1 x 100 - the 100 being promoted by the NLTTA and guess who is Event Secretary - none other than Richard Taylor! Derek proposed that the VTTA promote a 15-mile Championship and this was supported by those present and the proposal will be passed to the VTTA National Committee.

After the discussion with regard to the emailing of AGM notifications - which was thought to be inadequate to a number of members present - Derek asked that all members who were happy to have emailed notification that they email him so that he has their latest email address. Derek's email address is jasminebsd@hotmail.com

Treasurer Hazel Matthews reported that the Group membership was slightly down on last year. She asked that if notification of the AGM was sent out by post next year could membership renewal forms be included in order that they could be completed and returned with the subscriptions. Subs are now due at £13 single and £14 double.

Our Recorder gave a comprehensive report on the 2015 season which started with 'Last year I mentioned that 2014 was not a vintage year – but what a difference a year makes. The addition of two new members has led to a seismic shift in the Group's fortunes and with the back-up of our regular membership also showing some impressive improvement- it has been a very fast year'. The two new members? Richard Bideau and Steve Irwin!

The Group have a splendid array of Trophies which will be presented at our upcoming Luncheon with the Trader's Cup for the Group Championship - which superseded our old Best All Rounder - with the highest score in 4 of 10 selected events to count. No doubt about the winner with Steve Irwin scoring a maximum of 480 points, followed by Dave Hargreaves 473 and Harry Haseley 468 – all of the North Lancashire Road Club with the trio obviously unbeatable for the Team Shield also.

Theresa Taylor of Preston Cycling Club was our Woman Champion with 465 points.

As there were no 50 mile events this season on 'L' courses due to roadworks on the A66 in Cumbria and no 100 scheduled, the Group had selected events on nearby 'J' and 'D' courses at those distances. With Steve Irwin outright winner of the Anfield 100 and also winner of the National VTTA Championship in that event, he was additionally our Group 100 Champion on Standard and takes the Karrimor Trophy. Steve will also be awarded the Paddy Maloney Trophy for the 50 on Standard.

No question as to who will be awarded the Ken Priestley Trophy for Best on Standard in the 12 hours with Richard Bideau clocking up an outstanding 309 plus miles in the ECCA event to give a plus of 102.23 miles. Richard also takes the Dobson Trophy for the Best on Standard in three selected 25s on our 'L' courses with a plus

of 15:25.

The Baxter Rose Bowl for the 100 on Handicap goes to Dave Hargreaves for his ride in the Anfield event and Michael Cox – also NLRC – takes the Crowther Shield for 7th on Standard in that 100.

Nineteen Age Records have been set this year which is certainly encouraging, particularly as records must be set on 'L' courses and we had no 50 or 100 this year. Eight men – Steve Irwin, Richard Bideau, Mick Black, Paul Fleming, Dave Shorrocks, Harry Haseley, John Draper and Jim Lawley on his trike set records plus Theresa Taylor and Sue Cheetham and the mixed tandem record of our Group Treasurers Hazel and Bob Matthews. There is never much between Steve and Richard and it was certainly a tussle as both were aged 44 this year. With Richard losing some of his season due to recovering from that fantastic first ever 12 hour of his, Steve finally had the upper hand with a 19:19 10 on Levens and a brilliant course record of 49:30 on the Levens 25 course at the end of the season.

There has been an increase in the number of Senior Veterans competing this year with the over 70s including Rod Goodfellow, John Draper, Harry Haseley, Peter Knott, Jim Lawley, John Leach and Mike Westmorland.

Our annual Luncheon and Prize Presentation will be held at the usual venue, The Crofters Hotel on the A6 Garstang bypass on Sunday 10 January from 11:30am with Dinner at 1pm. Our Guest of Honour is John Morgan who will present the awards. Tickets are £20 and available from Terry Kay or Keith Tattersall.

Our Group members will be meeting on New Year's Day lunchtime at The Plough at Eaves as we have done for many years, with all members and friends welcome.

We welcome seven new or returning members to our Group, all of them members of the North Lancs Road Club. Gary Sedgwick, Stuart Timmins, Fraser Snape, Mark Haydock, Chris Stanley and one couple, Emily and Phillip Warner. We hope that all of them play an active part in the group and have an enjoyable year with us.

The first Pensioner (65) to beat four hours for a 100 mile Time Trial

With the social season in full swing, local time-trialling is on hold until the Christmas 10, so it is an appropriate time for a retrospective on 2015.

Firstly, two fast events held on the Blythe Bridge/ Etwall course in September, which were too late for my last report. The Burton & District CA 100, held on Saturday 15th September had 44 riders, including two women, under 4 hours – led by Charles Taylor, South Pennine RC in 3:21:31. Placed 5th, our fastest Group member was Ian Holbrook, Stone Wheelers, in 3:37:36 just ahead of Neil Skellern, Team Swift, 6th (winner in the 50 – 54 age category) with 3:38:38. Greg Dancer, Stone Wheelers, was fastest in the 60 – 64 category in 3:57:56. Greg has found that retiring from work has substantially improved his time-trialling. Barry Whittaker, Lyme RC, had a respectable 4:21:47 whilst John Baddeley, Stone Wheelers, was last to finish in 5:23:26.

A week later, Stone Wheelers held their 25 using the Weston end of the 100 course and it was won by Alex Royle (ex Abbotsford Park RC) Army CU in 48:17. Ian Holbrook was again our fastest Group member with 51:24 that placed him 6th in the event with Neil Skellern 8th in 51:41. Other Group members were Nige Wood, Wills' Wheelers, 53:32; Paul Shalliker, Cover-your-car, RT, 53:52; Mike Knudsen, Macclesfield Wheelers, 54:28; Martin Bowers, Stone Wheelers, 54:44; Dave Fearon, Weaver Valley, 55:26; Roger Wrenn, Macclesfield Wheelers, 58:29 and Barry Whittaker, Lyme RC, 59:17. The women were Christine Higgs, Macclesfield Wheelers, 1:03:20 and Caroline Fearon, Weaver Valley, 1:07:46 and John Baddeley wasn't last with his 1:07:59

As previously reported, Mike Cotgreave, Team Westmead 88, had qualified to ride in the UCI UWCT World Amateur time trial championships, held this year in Denmark on 3rd September. Mike had his bike checked by a UCI commissar at BC Manchester, but in Denmark he was involved in two attempts to get a shorter stem before getting their approval. Well, it was worth it in the end and 74-year-old Mike won the world bronze medal behind the Dutch winner and German runner-up.

Brian Camfield, our recorder, has provided a list of Group winners who will collect their awards at our luncheon on 29 November. The Group Best All Rounder again is Ian Holbrook, with +69:56 and will collect the Bert Starkey Trophy. The Congleton CC duo of Edgar Reynolds (+26:13) and Wayne Powell (+22:53) were runners up. Ian also takes the Butterworth trophy by winning the three distance competition with +52:33 ahead of team mate Greg Danger (+46:37) and Adrian Hughes, North Cheshire Clarion (+42:10).

The BAR on local courses was won by Edgar Reynolds +26:13 and he will take the Livingston Trophy, ahead of team mates Wayne Powell (+22:53) and Denise Hurst (+15:55). These three were reshuffled in the three distance competition on local courses, with Wayne Powell the winner in +15:54 ahead of Edgar (+14:50) and Denise (+13:09).

A new trophy for the short distance competition (2 at 10 miles and 2 at 25 miles) was won by Roger Wrenn, Macclesfield Wheelers, with +73:32 ahead of Adrian Hughes (+59:37) and Mike Cotgreave (+56:33). The same competition on local courses was won by Mike Cotgreave with +56:33 ahead of Adrian Hughes (+52:11) and Denise Hurst (+9:14). Mike also takes the 25-mile championship cup for the best aggregate performance in the two Group 25s with +26:22, whilst David Wright, Warrington RC, has won the ES Ward Trophy awarded for Best on Standard in our Group 50 with his +16:46.

Janet Barber, Seamons CC, wins the Memorial Handicap Shield, being first on handicap in the Group 25 with a handicap time of 51:05 and Denise Hurst wins the Lamp Trophy being last in the four distance BAR.

A number of age records were set during 2015. Mike Knudsen set national age records when, aged 50, he completed 26.351 miles (43.944 km) in the hour indoors on the track, setting five intermediate records during his ride, including 10 miles in 21:45 and 25 miles in 54:53. Several new Group age records were set including one for new member Darren Marironis, Coveryourcar RT, who set a 42 year old 10 record in 18:45. Ian Holbrook set a 46 year old 30 record with 1:01:13. Denise Hurst, at 61, set records at 50 in 2:26:26 and 100

in 5:25:38. Helen Bailey, Lyme RC, at 55 set a 10 record with 24:19; 15 in 40:48 and 50 2:23:14 and husband Chris, at 54, set the 15 record with 34:22.

Roger Wrenn at 71 revised figures at 10, 21:26; 25, 56:01 and 30 1:09:46 – whilst on 3 wheels, Vic Trigger, Crewe Clarion Wheelers, age 70 revised the 25 time down to 1:12:32.

The Group AGM was held at Goostrey Village Hall on Remembrance Sunday 8th November with 22 members in attendance. Before the meeting started, all stood for a minute's silence including in their thoughts the fallen in the wars and memories of the four group members who have passed away since the last AGM – Gil Taylor, Lance Tulip, Peter Middlehurst and Ron Johnson.

All the existing members of the committee were re-elected, Jim Ogden, Chairman and Editor; Brian Camfield, Secretary and Recorder; Jim Gresty, Treasurer; Helen Gresty, Lunch Organiser with Tony Farrell, Wilf Lewis and Roy Deakin making up the committee. Jim Gresty reported that he has recruited Phil Guy (Merseyside VTTA) to be our auditor. The Group had no items to put forward to the National AGM, indicating at least their acceptance of the revised standard tables. With our membership over 200, the Group will be represented at National level by three members; Brian Camfield, Helen and Jim Gresty.

From this neck of the woods, the 2015 season is just about finished. Now, it's time to take stock. Weather-wise, a large part of the summer was disappointing, many events were affected by wind and rain; however, September and early October with high pressure in control, saw more favourable conditions and, as a result, improved performances.

I guess the stand-out event for South Wales District was promotion of the National 100 Championship on 5 July and from glancing through the results from 116 finishers, it appears to have been a good day for weather, with only 3 DNFs. Although, I might add, a surprising 27 entrants failed to start, perhaps unaware that R100/8A is a fast course. I mention this event because VTTA South Wales has just 59 members and one of them posted a magnificent 3:38:41 to make the National Championship podium; well done Paul Gamlin. While I am on the subject of 100 mile events, it's noticeable that fewer members are now prepared to tackle this distance and I have to say that they are missing out. From my own point of view, the additional training and long ride on race day is not only a great way to increase strength and condition, but also a real confidence booster for shorter distances

The Welsh Championship 10 was held on a rare fine day, Sunday 16 August. Amongst our members, the fastest was 43-year-old Paul Gamlin, posting 19:57 +6:16. However, our 10 Mile Trophy went to 69 year old Stuart Evans, Port Talbot Wheelers with 22:26 + 6:26. Other performances were Paul Hayward, Cwmcarn Paragon 20:55, Dave Brice 21:24, Rod Hicks 21:29, Mike Portlock 21:44, Paul Cannon 22:09, Mike Broadbent 23:15, Paul Durrent 23:40, Mark Williams 23:51, John Shehan 23:58, Ian Lewis 24:53, Peter Murrieri 25:00 and finally, last man in the event, your 79 year old correspondent with 26:19. I would commend Dax Jenkins and the Pontypool Road Club for their hard work in making this Welsh Time Trial Championship a success.

Three events held in September produced some rewarding times from our group. Taking them in

chronological order, Les Thomas ran the Port Talbot Wheelers 25 on Sunday 6th September, an event that has seen the British 25 record broken on three recent occasions. It didn't happen this time, nevertheless, quite a few competitors were pleased to post PBs. Among our group Lyn Jones beat 51 minutes with 50:55 + 15:31, Paul Cannon produced 55:09 +16:07, Andrea Parish posted 55:51 +16:58, Derek Morgan, who looks after the standards for the group, recorded 1:07:26 +9:33 and your correspondent in his 2nd outing of the year, staggered round to record 1:06:21 +13:45.

The next outing was Cardiff 100 Miles 10 on September 12th. As in the Welsh Champs 10, Stuart Evans, 22:02 +6:50 just shaded Paul Gamlin 19:42 +6:31 for standard, although I am sure that Paul was pleased with 2nd place overall. Other good showings were: Lyn Jones 20:47 +5:22, Paul Cannon 22:19 +5:40, Rod Hicks, 21:23 +5:22, Dave Brice 21:27 +5:37, Chris Massey 21:49 +4:24, Sue Shook 23:11 +6:21, John Shehan 23:39 +5:13. A few others from the group reached the timekeeper without producing their most exciting performances; maybe conditions varied during the timescale of the event.

I was sorry to miss the Bynea 25 on 20 September because some early starters enjoyed some of the best conditions of the season. A few of my friends posted their best times of the year, Clare Greenwood 58:59 +15:54, Bob Jones 59:14 +12:02, Pete Murrieri 57:39 +11:40, Sally Harmer 1:05:03 +9:20, and Ken Squibb, just before his 80th birthday, 1:10:22 +9:44 and long-serving timekeeper Norman James 1:13:20 +4:21 – I understand that later starters missed the magic weather window, although I would commend Paul Cannon's 53:48 +17:28, good enough to take the 2nd standard prize and Paul Gamlin's 50:20 +16:19, a reward for consistency throughout the season.

The final event in the area, was the Welsh Championship 50 on 27 September. I will start by congratulating Kieron Davies for his winning ride 1:39:16 which must be somewhere near to a Welsh Record. Perhaps it was a fast day, although other performances suggest quite an ordinary day. Compared with the Cardiff 100 RC

50 on 2 August, Dave Brice was 8 seconds slower in 1:57:21+24:28 and John Shehan was 2 minutes 8 seconds slower in 2:10:27 +21:51, while Andrea Parish improved 56 seconds in 2:05:34 +24:13. Other postings were Mike Broadbent 2:06:34, Pete Murrieri 2:09:29 and Derek Morgan a gallant 2:31:51. Finally two old friends and rivals, John Murphy and Vince Jenkins, both 75 years old, competed, their times 2:16:43 and 2:18:33 respectively show the difficulty of older riders converting fast 10s into longer 50s.

One of our oldest members, 80-year-old Ken Squibb, Cardiff Ajax CC, has told me that the VC Sevale 10 on 26 September had been his last ever time trial. Ken had ridden time trials since 1952 and had competed in the sport over many of the intervening 63 years. He cherished all his rides to the extent of creating a treasure trove of old finish sheets. Ken did not do internet and disagreed strongly with the modern habit of event secs not bothering to use the royal mail to send results. Luckily, he had on-line friends who would print this information for him. Happily, Ken will continue to ride his bike and meet his mates at Cowbridge Common Café on Wednesday mornings.

For me, I hope to spend some time in Mallorca this coming winter and be fit enough to ride some time trials in 2016. In the meantime, Happy New year and safe cycling to all of our readers.

Our new treasurer, Mary Corbett, had to report that the Group had suffered relatively significant deficits in each of the last two years. Most members will not know that the greater part of their annual subscription is required by VTTA rules to be passed to NEC. This puts great strain on Groups' finances especially as the Group has a goodly number of members aged 80+ meriting nil subscription. In the circumstances, the AGM agreed that the Group membership subscription be increased from £12 to £14 (£14 to £16 for couples). There is not space to list all of the age records achieved by Wessex members in 2015, merely to say that claims for six at National level and 25 at Group level are claimed. We also believe that the number of entries for Standard awards (40), with at least 25 members achieving at least one and

seven meriting a plaque with success at four distances.

Yorkshire

Another season has passed into history. A cold wind-swept affair, the Summer didn't put in an appearance. Considering the number of gale-swept Saturday afternoons, some great rides were achieved. Our final event of the season was Mike Penrice's 10 in September on the V718. The event attracted a full field of 150 plus four tandems. It was the usual windy Saturday afternoon, but some fine rides were done. The winner was Ron Hallam (84), South Pennine RC; a regular winner of our events, he recorded 25:08 +8:09 for a convincing win. Second place was taken by our own Brian Sunter (72), Condor RC, 21:51 +7:35. In third place was Andy Jackson (40), Team Swift, with a blistering 18:49 +7:10; his ride was also the fastest of the day. So there was a 44-year spread covering the first three. The best woman on standard was Gill Henshaw (81), VC Long Eaton, 28:50 +5:49. Fastest woman on the day, Louise Day (56), Team Swift, 24:02. Standard winners on a tandem were Chris Duggleby (60), Brough Wheelers, with Graham Barker (66), Rockingham CC, 22:23 +2:49. Fastest tandem pair were Don Saunders (66) with Declan Davis (17), CC Breckland, 20:42. So that was it. Thanks to Mike and his team of helpers and especially all the home baking, cakes and buns etc, which raised £88.41 which has been donated to the Yorkshire Air Ambulance.

Aside from running this event, Mike has competed on the tandem with wife Barbara. Riding for Seacroft Wheelers, from six rides this season they have set three VTTA national age records. In the YCF 15, they updated their own record to 39:57 at combined age 74. Also in this event, Robby Krygsman (53), Team Swift, set a solo record of 34:49. Next up, in the VTTA North 50, their first since 2009, they established a record for 74/75 of 2:22:25. Barbara's actual age is 83, so she is probably the oldest woman to

complete a 50-mile TT; and finally, in the East Anglian VTTA 30, they did 1:15:45, taking 2:55 off George and Mary Dawson's 74/75 record, so congratulations, Mike and Barbara.

Now to next year's events: We will only be running two 10s, having not found a promoter for the 25. Andy Vaughn will run a 10 on the V718 on Saturday 23 July for VTTA members only, with preference to Yorkshire members. Mike Penrice will continue with his 10 on Saturday 3 September for VTTA members only; again this will be on V718. In addition to losing events, we have now lost the Rideout Lunch; John Churchman decided to call off this year's lunch when he had sold only 18 tickets; he decided, quite rightly, that it was no longer viable and so sadly this function, which was a really good 'do', is now lost. Our thanks must go to John for running this lunch for many years – it's your loss, guys.

Stan Mills of the Yorkshire RC has spent four months in hospital undergoing five operations. He is now back home and I am sure we all wish him a full recovery; all the Best, Stan.

Now to our AGM held at Collingham. There was the usual turn-out on a foul day; there were 16 present, down 4 on last year. The average age would be mid-seventies – par for the course these days. Tony Stott, our Secretary, reported that the membership was up to 202, which includes life members. It was felt that the rise in membership was due to the fact that we have restricted our two tens at Hull to VTTA members only, so riders have joined to set a ride on this speed-track; what a joke! If we stop running the tens on V718, will the group be there in ten years?

Tony also mentioned the problem of collecting subs (£11 single, £13 couples). In future, if subs are not paid by the end of February, members will be deleted from membership. Our Treasurer, George Young, reported that our finances were sound, with a small a small trading plus on the year of £43.19.

Cliff Ralphs, our Racing Secretary, produced a fine report on the season. Congratulations, Brian Sunter. Condor RC, on winning both the 30 and 50 mile National Championships. Our Recorder, Bob Tate, reported that there were only 14 people who had attempted standards this year, as

opposed to 18 last year. A suggestion was put forward that it may be better if the fee be paid when the claims were put in at the end of the season and not before the rides were done; this idea was rejected. As we are not longer running a 25, the trophies will be awarded on performances in the Holm Valley Wheelers 25, which will bring the 25 in line with all the other distances, with the exception of the 10.

Mickie Hornby reported that tickets were now available for the Annual Lunch (£22) and hoped the Annual Lunch wouldn't go the same as the Rideout Lunch which, as mentioned earlier, has fallen by the wayside. So tickets are available from Mickie (01904-766113). As reported in the last issue, the Lunch is to be held on 31 January 2016 (not as on the card) and our Guest of Honour will be Gill Henshaw, VC Long Eaton.

It was reported that at the recent CTT Division meeting, they are grappling with the problem caused by riders entering events months in advance; we await the outcome.

Our officials for next year remain the same, with some exceptions: Cliff Ralphs will continue as Racing Secretary, but only for one more year – you have been warned! Geoff Hornby has stepped down as Medals Secretary so after the Lunch in January, that's it! There was no volunteer to take his place – not surprising, as the people at this meeting have jobs; so this position is vacant. Is there anybody out there who will take this on or is this another hole below the water-line? Geoff would give his guidance to anybody willing to take the job on.

Bob, our Chairman, reluctantly agreed to continue as Recorder, but would really like to step down. Mickie will organise the Lunch in 2017 but again this could be the last time. Tony Stott and Geoff Hornby will be auditors, Bob and Cliff our CTT delegates, Phill Hurt, our YCF delegate; Joe O'Doherty and Mike Penrice will be our VTTA National delegates. Yours truly remains as Press Secretary.

Thanks are due to all your officials for their work on your behalf; half of them are over 80! This is a sad reflection on the younger members – is it only about riding on V718? Prove me wrong. So that was your AGM for another year.

Now to our BAR for 2015: Bob Tate, our Recorder, had all his calculations plunged into disarray due to the short course claims regarding the Stockton Wheelers 100. As a result of this, the qualifiers for our Three Distance Competition and our BAR were halved. So Mike Cross, Yorkshire RC, wins both competitions and is our Yorkshire Vets BAR for 2015. Our Short Distance Competition was a close affair with Peter Yates (62), Otley CC, +1:18:47, just beating Brian Sunter (72), +1:18:11 by 36 seconds. At the time of writing, it would appear that we don't have a Women's BAR, so at the moment that is the result of our BAR Competition. By the next issue, things should have been resolved.

So Yorkshire has another Women's World Champion in Lizzie Armitstead, who local TV cheerfully informed us had got a "Rainbow Journey"! A car driver will be BBC Sports Personality. Neither Lizzie Armitstead nor Laura Trott are even nominated. Laura Trott has won more European Championships than any other rider in history and rarely comes away from any Championship without a Gold Medal. The London Six-Day flew under the British media radar. So much for cycling becoming a mainstream sport!

How many managers will Leeds United have this season? Answers on a large sheet of paper! I have done this job now for 20 years; will there still be a Group in another 20?

Bob Giles, Time Trial Secretary, reported that 2015 had been a reasonably successful year with eight time trials scheduled embracing around 465 entries (2014: 421). Unfortunately, due to Bob's accident in May, the June 25 had to be cancelled which reduced the actual number of riders in the year to 390. There had also been a problem with the Group's final event of the year, the 15 run in October which had had to be moved because of last minute road works on the course. With the assistance of Tony Peachey and Kent Constabulary, a new course was measured and adopted at very short notice.

About 2006, there was another move to Clacton in Essex, riding with Colchester Rovers in their Evening 10 events. Talking of old friends: those who visited the Wolsey Theatre at Ipswich for the play *Beryl* (yes, the one and only Beryl) found this a very interesting production. Those who did not go missed a treat; maybe they were already familiar with the play on radio, but this was different. It would have been so pleasing for Jonathan Weatherly to have seen the excellent entry for the Hill Climb at Semer, for which he was to have

been event secretary; this event was notable for the emergence of two new clubs, Boxford Bike Club and Manningtree Wheelers, both of whom had riders well placed. Is the latter a re-emergence of the old Manningtree BC? It would be good if it were, as they were winners of the team trophy, former property of the Essex & Suffolk Border Combine, to which that club belonged in far-off days. CC Sudbury took over the Hill Climb when the Combine was wound up, as it was always a popular day out.

Cycling is certainly booming in Suffolk; not only new Clubs, but West Suffolk Wheelers report an explosion of members after joining forces with the tri-club. Their women should be well to the fore in 2016. Wolsey RC have an increase in numbers taking part in all forms of the sport, as far afield as Spain. Karen Eaton continues to be the top racing woman as well as being "Maid of all Work"! President Mick Pepper receives the Gordon Irons Trophy this year for his sterling work for the East Anglian Group as archivist, which he took over years ago from our founder Herbie Nevill.

Not too much news filters through from Norfolk as Chris Nudds had to give way to the "new kid on the block" aka or newly renovated, Len Benton, who has taken two major awards, the Ron Fisher/Jack King Memorial Shield and the 10 mile points contest. However, Chris has given the Essex lads a punch below the belt by gaining the title of ECCA Vets BAR. In case you wonder, their method of calculation is different to that of the Group.

Talking of Len reminds me of days gone by. Here is "Veteran" report from Herbie Nevill:

"Looking back to 1975 we find we have had a very good year as will be reported at our AGM in February. Group funds are quite healthy, our racing activities were a great improvement on previous years with entries up and standard plusses much higher. Entries for standard were also up and our Recorder reports that more of the younger lads are getting bigger plusses, which is indeed a very good sign. Pete Leat, Essex Roads CC, at 41 was our Group BAR, winning the Lionel Lincoln Memorial Shield, with George White, Eagle RC, at 68 years in 2nd place. Pete was also 63rd in the RTTC National BAR Table with

an average over 50 and 100 miles and 12 hours of 22.733 mph. Winner of the Group Championship over 25, 50 and 100 miles for the Haynes Shield was Jack King, Colchester Rovers CC with +50:29 (+1.818 mph - 20.639 mph). Eddie Lees, Chelmer CC (53) won the Nevill Goblet over 25, 30 and 50 miles with an average of 23.631 mph (+3.246 mph). Fastest Club Team within the Group was Chelmer CC (Bob Haworth and Pete Horsnell (+2.162 - +1.513). Our Vets were well to the fore at the Chelmer CC prize presentation recently, the first three in their club's BAR were Vets - Pete Horsnell, Ernie Taylor and Bob Haworth."

In 2015 there appeared a new star in the Chelmer firmament, namely Alex Eason - a third generation club cyclist, whose friends paid his VTTA subs for him to fill the gap left when Antony Stapleton has been unable to start. By strange coincidence, his father Laurie of the 1950s all-conquering Crescent Wheelers Team headed by Ken Craven, rode in the ECCA 12 60 years ago, 1955, and his grandfather Albert of the Warren CC, also rode 90 years ago in 1925. Alan excelled himself in the Group 100 and 12 hour and was a member of the team on age standard in both. He actually started with the Chelmer in schoolboy racing, but his competitive career has, up until now, progressed in fits and starts. He is also Secretary of the Club.

Talking of younger members, Sue Triplow deserves a mention for winning the Syd Parkinson Cup BoS 2x10, 2x25. Following the AGM, in future this will include a 50. She also put a new name on the 10 mile points shield. Could be the first time for the same name on both trophies? Her friend Jo Butcher, also of Braintree, achieved fame in her first racing season; she was amazed to find that, along with Mary Bower, not yet a Vet, and Ann Shuttleworth, she had helped to gain a competition record for Chelmer CC (TBC) with her first attempt at 30 miles. Event Secretary was multi-tasking John Golder, who should have submitted a full report?

The AGM produced some lively discussion, but no major changes. Officials were re-elected with the exception of Christine Yareham, who stood down after some years as Treasurer, with

services given “over and above the call of duty”, which has resulted in the books being in perfect order to hand over to Keith Dorling, who volunteered for this task. Both he and his wife Wendy are well known ‘testers’, Wendy also being CTT Secretary for London East and a timekeeper, as is her father Ian Davidson, though he has asked to “retire” of late. Another family busy in the sport.

The very successful Lunch, which followed the AGM, was again organised by Ian MacKenzie assisted, as always, by his wife Vivienne. Only about 50 were present – a poor show from a membership of over 300 and not very rewarding for the hard-working officials. It was unfortunate that our regular MC was not able to be present owing to health problems, but Tony Clarke, after a little briefing from Mick, nobly rose to the challenge and he and his wife Sue not only produced the immaculate array of cups, shields and medals, but took home for storage those that were not claimed. Long may this successful partnership continue!

This year we were honoured by the presence of National President Carole Gandy and her escort John Hawkrige. Carole needs no introduction in the cycling world. Is it rude to say she has been around for a long time? She gave a very brief and amusing resume of her illustrious career before presenting the prizes and endeared herself to all by her friendly manner and her recollections of the women/girls she had ridden against in Essex were very well received. The last National President to visit us was the redoubtable Ethel Brambleby and before that Dick Clarke was a close friend of Herbie Nevill, founder of our Group.

Yes, it’s the time of the year for memories and to wish you all a happy season with plenty of good times.

**The Danish Adventure for Midlands rider
Vince Jenkins - back in the saddle after
beating cancer**

"A Silver Medal and no 2 in the World, I still can't believe it, but it's true."

The story starts when Vince Jenkins from Daventry, entered the Tour of Cambridge Chrono Time Trial, a UCI qualifying event that took place

not long after he had managed a 22 minute at the VTTA National 10, another target on his list. However, he had to race in a lower age group and was not over confident of qualification.

On the day it was howling a gale so strong that the barriers were being blown over and this continued all the way out of the industrial park from a ramp start inside an exhibition building. Once out into the countryside it was a twisty, hilly course on closed, but narrow country roads with sharp descents before returning to the main road back into Peterborough. It had a real razzmatazz stage-managed prize medal presentation where Vince was delighted to collect his Bronze Medal.

The story really starts back in 2012 when the 74-year-old won the British and Welsh 25-mile, and the Welsh and Midland 10-mile time trial championships for his age group. Just months later he was shocked to discover he had an aggressive form of skin cancer. "I couldn't believe it when they said it was cancer – I had just clocked my fastest-ever time for 25 miles and felt fine," exclaimed Vince. It had spread to his saliva glands forcing him to undergo major surgery followed by a two-week stay at Northampton General Hospital and six weeks of radiotherapy. Vince's treatment was successful but he had to write off last year's racing season while he recovered.

Back to this year, and following his success at the qualifying event, Vince received an email from the UCI in Switzerland inviting him to compete in the World Championship for the Masters and Amateurs at Hobro in Denmark on 3rd September. This really was a big deal and maybe the biggest event he could ever ride so how could he possibly refuse?

Vince was fortunate his sponsor Leisure Lakes Bikes kindly agreed to get the necessary UCI legal frame and bars but despite the fact they were ordered in good time, the bike was not ready in its legal form, and correct size, until the weekend before he left for Denmark with Leisure Lakes, which has a store at Daventry's Abbey Retail Park doing all they could to meet the deadline.

In early September, Vince and his wife Margarita flew to Denmark and then took a four-hour drive



to Hobro. On arrival the bike had to be reassembled and ready for bike check and registration. Soon it was time to check out the course, attend the race briefing and finally walk proudly with the GB flag parade behind the band and chocolate box Danish Solders in traditional dress, with 40 other nation flags into the centre of Hobro.

Come the big day, Vince put on his first ever GB skin suit, signed on and then managed to borrow a turbo from the Australian Marquee for his warm up. Once over, another bike check before entering the starter tent, and then the famous five finger start indicator together with the beeps and

lights before Vince was off down the ramp. Through a technical section out of the park and as he 'up'ed the tempo he tried to get into the big ring, but horror of horrors it would not change. Wondering if his race was already over, Vince approached a sharp left hander and long steep climb away from the town so just had to concentrate on pacing himself so as not to blow it in this first section of the 20km.

Passing the 30 second man from South Africa before the top of the hill, Vince had another go to get in to the big ring, but no success, so pressed on in higher revs. Then suddenly Vince was in the big ring and getting near to the goal of 50km

per hour. He could see his minute man in the distance going up the next long climb before turning left at the top for an up and down loop and more sharp turns for the return leg. Playing it safe, Vince decided not to cut the corner but go round the traffic bollard and then two more climbs and a dangerous descent before the long grind home. Motoring down a super fast section Vince made a wicked right hand turn at the bottom into the technical section within the park, where a number of riders had already crashed.

It was now flat out between the barriers, a hard left and right for the final sprint back on the tri-bars and under the finishing banner. Freewheeling to a halt, the moment and occasion finally got to him after all the stress, build up and travel, not to mention all that work during the long way back from the surgery and everything that went with it. As Vince shed the first of a few tears of relief, he saw his wife running towards him with great excitement. It had just been announced over the loudspeaker and on the Big Screen that Vince had come second. Then the mobile starts going mad, as apparently all this had been shown live on You Tube and friends and relatives were sending their congratulations.

The excited couple made their way to the town centre for the next big event of the Awards

presentation, where Vince received a briefing about the strict protocol to be followed. All podium winners had to be in their national racing kit and were not allowed to wear either sun glasses or hats.

Vince led out behind the podium girls in their black dresses, each carrying a silver tray with the appropriate medal. The noise was deafening as the fanfare of trumpets played, together with the announcement over the loudspeaker as 1st 2nd and 3rd stood in front of their podium.

The Danish rider took his Bronze Medal and mounted the podium and then it Vince's turn to be announced and receive the medal from the UCI Official, followed by the Bouquet of Flowers from the Danish Cycling President and a big wave to the crowd with the final fanfare for the new World Champion from Czechoslovakia who beat him by just three seconds.

"Not in my wildest dreams would I have thought that such an event would have been possible after what I have been through and I would like to thank my surgeon, the staff at Northampton General and Macmillan Nurses together with my wonderful wife and my generous sponsor, Leisure Lake Bikes, for helping to get me there," concluded Vince.

Lance Tulip



1921—2015

It is with great regret that we report the recent death of Lance Tulip, one of Withington Wheelers longest serving members.

In 1965 Rod Slater wrote a series of articles for the Withington Wheelers Club Journals entitled *Stalwarts of the Club*. Lance was Club Champion for four consecutive years from 1948 to 1951 and during these years he broke nearly every club record. His racing prowess is recognised in the article which is reproduced here in its entirety.

“Stalwarts of the Club

After joining the club in mid-1939 his racing career had barely commenced when the war began and it was not until late 1946 that he had the chance to really get started on the climb that was to make him Club Champion and holder of several club records.

Lance came second in the first post war Club 25 with a time of 1.15.09. In the spring of 1947 the Novices event was run as a second class event for riders not having beaten 1.08.00 and he gained the Novice award with a ride of 1.10.50 taking 10th fastest position. This figure was

beaten several times during the year and his best time was 1.07.08 in the Clarion 25. Not content with short distance rides he rode all distances up to 12 hours including fastest time in a Club 50 with 2.27.48.

The following year (1948) saw a further improvement in all his times, fastest in a Club 25 with 1.06.24, Club 50 record with 2.12.52, 5.14.06 in the Pyramid 100 and then in the September he was fastest in the Club in the M&DTTA 12 Hour with 223 miles and 6 furlongs taking the club record and sixth overall position in the event. This year he was winner of the Club BAR competition with an average speed of 19.94 mph.

Lance started 1949 by winning the Club Rough Stuff event and then went on to set three Club records. He was 5th fastest overall in the M&DTTA 12 Hour with a distance of 230.1 miles, clocked 4.44.36 in the Pyramid 100 and helped by Jim Forbes took the Tandem 50 record with a time of 2.05.58. For the second year in succession he topped the Club BAR table, this time with 20.706 mph.

After winning the 1950 Rough Ride he went on to take the Hilly 25 then a new Club 25 record on the Brook course with 1.05.18 which he broke later in the year with a ride of 1.03.57 in the Altrincham Ravens 25. The 50 record he also broke twice to leave it at 2.11.41 in the Altrincham Ravens 50. Consistent rides in the long distance events brought the Club BAR title for the third time (20.807 mph).

1951, and the Rough Stuff and the Hilly 25 again fall to him and then he settled down to the more serious events of the year which included several 50s under 2 hours 15 minutes and the Withington-Chester-Withington Club record in 3.27.45. For the fourth year in succession he was Club Champion.

1952 started in the usual way (Rough Stuff win) and he then turned in a series of good rides including a PB time of 1.03.28 in the Altrincham Ravens 25. Although better than his previous figure Stan Foster had recently taken the record and later in the year also took the title of Club Champion which had been so ably held by Lance over such a long period.

The records show reduced activity for the next few years but Lance came back in 1958 to win his old favourite the Rough Stuff by two minutes. It's not easy to keep fitness at all distances but the youngsters had better look out when the next Rough stuff event is staged because they won't have things all their own way if Lance can be persuaded to come out of his well-earned retirement!

Younger riders should be aware that rides generally were much slower in the immediate post war period than they are now, but it is interesting to note how Lance excelled at the longer distance events: his best 12 hour ride of over 230 miles would be very respectable even today over 65 years later! Time trialling in Lance's heyday was quite different to the more scientific and highly trained game it is now. At that time it was customary for riders to ride out to the start of the event,

strip off mudguards and saddlebags and stow them under a hedge before riding - no comfortable headquarters then with cups of tea and cakes! After the event, which would probably have started at 6am, riders would re-assemble their machines, change out of their black racing gear and go on the club-run to get some more miles in.

Family life and children took priority for the next few years with Lance's racing taking a back seat. Never the less the Withington had a lively social side in those days and the Annual Club Dinner was always an enjoyable occasion. Lance and Edna hardly missed a dinner and were always the first up on the dance floor.

Throughout his seventy five years as a member of Withington Wheelers Lance has held various posts including General Secretary for a number of decades and he was President of the club from 2000 to 2006. Over the years Lance and Edna have always been the first to volunteer for club events, marshalling and catering at all the club races. The Wild Wales Challenge rides of the late 80s and early 90s were wonderful occasions, Lance and Edna and a number of the older Withington Wheelers would find a likely spot halfway up a welsh mountain and after 40 or 50 miles the Withington Wheelers riding the event would turn a corner to find decorating tables groaning under cakes and tea and sandwiches.

The photo below was taken at Lance and Edna's when the Withington gathered at 1 Tuscan Road in 2011 to celebrate Lance's 90th birthday.

Lance was a great clubman always ready to help with events and although his cycling activities were curtailed in recent years this did not apply to his other great interest - dancing. This was not limited to the annual Club Dinner but was a constant source of delight to him and Edna and it was only a few days before he died that "a funny turn" at a regular dance gave warning that time was running out. It was a wonderful way to go and this will surely be a great comfort to Edna and family to whom we offer our deepest sympathy.

Joan Helen Walker 1929-2015

Joan was born in Dagenham on 22 February 1929. Our first meeting was sometime in 1947 after the Royal Navy decided they could do without me. This was at the Becontree Wheelers Clubroom in Hornchurch, I can't say it was 'love at first sight', but the first attraction was our mutual love of cycling,

So time went by and it soon became apparent what a tough young lady Joan was. Because her Mum was always ill, she was brought up by her Dad, himself a veteran of World War 1 and a member of the

Polytechnic CC and a famous old club, the Oak CC. If that was not a good cycling apprenticeship for her, he was also an acrobat, wrestler and all round strong man. He used his daughter as his training partner, which helped her to look after herself during those war years.

And so we decided to make a life together which neither of us dreamed would last for so many years. Her strength of character was fully stretched when our son John caught polio at three years of age. The pair of them fought it with many hospital visits.

Lightning does not strike twice, but it did for John when he had a serious motor cycle accident that nearly cost him his life. He survived, but left his arm on the road.

Once again Joan took over the role of nurse. She cycled to Harold Wood every day to push him around the hospital grounds in a wheelchair and eventually persistence paid off and he was allowed home to begin his convalescence. After a while John met Caroline who took over looking after John to this day,

Joan resumed her riding with the Forty-Plus CC, which took her mind off her troubles and definitely gave her a new lease of life. Cycling not only builds strength of character, but keeps you physically fit. Joan never visited a doctor, never took medicine. The only visible sign that she was getting old was that she started to be quiet! That always worried me, as it was completely against her natural 'joie de vivre', as anybody who knew her in the cycling world would testify, As part of the Rosslyn Ladies CC, she was known as 'Bambi' which just says it all!

The end was swift and painless. She went into Queen's Hospital on Monday 1st June, John and I visited her on the 3rd of June and she died in her sleep at 11pm on Thursday 4th June.

Dennis was once taken to hospital after a fall from his bike and found it hilarious that, because his muscle was so firm, the nurse's needle bent when they tried to inject his leg. He rode his bike into his eighties and was devastated when his health deteriorated and he could no longer get out.

Dennis spent the last three years of his life in The Oaks Nursing Home in Newark where his diabetes and health deteriorated. He was admitted to Kingsmill Hospital in Mansfield on 23rd August 2015. He could always be found laughing and joking with the nurses but was always very appreciative of their help. He was a true gentleman until the very end. The Members of the Nott's and East Midlands VTTA, Newark Castle Cycling Club and his cycling friends would like to give Diane and Grandchildren Mark, Stacey and Luke, their sincere condolences and good wishes.

ROY MANSER
29:12:1933 – 5:8:2015



Ian Turner, Kent Group Reporter, reported in the previous Veteran that Roy had passed away. I would like to reiterate Ian's condolences to Roy's wife Pam and to their son Andrew. Roy suffered heart failure on the way home from a meeting of the Wednesday Wobblers group on 5 August.

Roy grew up in Barming, Maidstone, and joined the San Fairy Ann CC in 1947, becoming a lifelong member. He soon began racing and with few cyclists owning cars, Roy's father Bill, who ran a haulage business, would sometimes transport Roy and his club mates to events on the back of an open lorry.

Roy was extremely versatile on a bike. Similarly, his apprenticeship as a blacksmith and farrier led him into welding, before he moved into carpentry and then civil engineering. Roy could turn his hand

to anything and, in 1954 he built his first tandem frame, from two solos welded together. Laurie Broad accompanied Roy on this machine at the start of their very long-standing tandem partnership.

National Service in 1955 saw Roy serving in Egypt, where he joined the Exiles CC. Roy formed some life-long cycling friendships there and at the end of his two years, he cycled home, via the Alps!

Roy had been making steady progress at racing, but his return home coincided with a period of rapid improvement. Roy's break-through at national level came with his 5th place in the 1958 National 25. Many wins followed over the next decade, but Roy's best ever season was undoubtedly 1962, when he finished 6th in the BBAR. His qualifying ride in that year's Bath Road 100 has passed into Kent cycling folk-lore. Down as number one on the start sheet, and arriving by van from Maidstone just minutes before his start time, Roy set off in the dark, before going on to record 4:09:26! This was on the day that Frank Colden became the second sub-four hour 100 miler.

A win in the prestigious Roadmen's 25 mile track event at Herne Hill was a main highlight of 1963, and the following year Roy became the 4th fastest 50 miler on record with his winning 1:52:35 in the Harrogate event on the Boroughbridge course. This helped him to achieve 13th place in the BBAR.

Roy's wife Pam is also a life-long cyclist, and they married in 1965. In the same year Roy won the Zeus Racing Club 25 on the Southend Road course. He defeated a top-class field, including Paul Bennett, who produced the first ever 53 minute 25 on the same course later that season. In 1969 Roy won his fourth Kent CA BAR title, and by this time he had also been Kent Road Race Champion twice.

Roy then retired temporarily, but he was back as a veteran in 1977 and like many others, soon going faster than ever. Roy won further Kent Road Race Championships in 1979 and 1983. He took second and third places in the VTTA National 10 Championships of 1983 and 1984 respectively, and second place in the 1986 VTTA National 12 hour Championship. From 1996 onwards Roy won numerous medals in National and World Masters Track Championships. He was also the League International Track Champion in 2002.

Tandems continued to feature in Roy's racing and he and Anthony Wallis set a new tandem 10 competition record of 18:17 in 1989. But Roy's original partnership with Laurie Broad also continued and they achieved a series of national veterans' age records in the 1990s. Their 10 and 30 records of 19:44 and 58:48 still stand.

Roy's many racing successes were only a part of his involvement in the sport. He was an excellent frame builder and a keen mountain bike enthusiast, leading many off-road rides. Roy also enjoyed skiing as his second sport for many years. But more than this, Roy was a great all-round clubman, taking part in all aspects of club life; leading club runs and training rides, coaching and mentoring other riders, promoting open time trials and road races, and serving on various committees.

All of this, together with Roy's very modest and approachable nature, made him a legendary figure in the cycling world. I have lost count of the number of cyclists I have met who have asked after Roy, upon learning I was from Kent. The first time I can recall this happening was in South West Ireland! Roy's passing truly marks the end of an era.
